Celebrating Lilly Reich, Co-Designer of the Barcelona Chair

A pioneer of tubular design, an expert embroiderer and Bauhaus master, Lilly Reich has recently added a new title to her pedigree: co-designer of the renowned Barcelona Chair.

The iconic steel and leather chair has long been attributed solely to legendary German designer and architect, Ludwig Mies van der Rohe, and in a story all-too-familiar for women designers, Reich's contribution was passed over in favor of recognition of her male counterpart.





Anna Castelli Ferrieri's Revolutionary Bestseller

Designed by Kartell co-founder Anna Castelli Ferrieri, the Componibili storage collection made its debut at Salone de Mobile in 1967. The first modular plastic furniture of its kind, Ferrieri set out to create an innovative design that would be both beautiful and functional—and now more than a half century later, the icon can be found in the permanent collections of New York's MoMA and Paris' Centre Pompidou, and in homes and offices around the world.

Supremely minimal and sleek in appearance, Componibili's adept versatility has ensured its status as a bestseller and a quintessential emblem of modern Italian design. As part of the brand's "Kartell loves the planet" initiative, Componibili joined the ranks of eco-friendly design in 2019. Retaining its original and playful cylindrical form, the new and fully sustainable Componibili is made from 100% renewable raw materials.



And yet historic evidence uncovered by Albert Pfeiffer, former Knoll VP of Design and Management, suggests that Reich not only co-designed the chair but was the primary designer of the entire Barcelona Pavilion with van der Rohe for the 1929 World Exhibition in Barcelona. Just short of a century later, it is high time the name Lilly Reich takes its belated-yet proper-place in the cast of influential, innovative designers of the German modernist movement.



The Evolution of the Task Lamp

A far cry from the shadow-casting flame that once illuminated desks and workspaces around the globe, the modern task lamp has evolved to include intelligent features like touch-responsive dimmability and wireless induction charging. From the first adjustable, electric desk lamps in 1921 to the latest–and slimmest–smart designs on the market, the evolution of task lamps is deeply tied to their very function: the desire to shed a better light on the task at hand.

With inspiration ranging from car suspension systems (Anglepoise's Original 1227 Task Lamp) to hotel design (Louis Poulsen's AJ Table Lamp) and the need to better see design sketches as they came to life with pen and paper (Artemide's Tizio), the omnipresent but never overlooked task lamp is a symbol of perpetual innovation.



The Vertigo Family Goes Bronze

Experimenting with stretching ribbons, Constance Guisset imagined the dreamy and wide-brimmed Vertigo Pendant as a young design student. As the fixture grew larger, the ribbons became thinner, light was added, and the now-iconic pendant found its home with Parisian-based studio, Petite Friture.

In a line known for its contemporary, eco-conscious designs, Petite Friture's Vertigo Pendant is no exception. Now available in an exclusive bronze finish, the floating fixture is fit with a built-in, dimmable LED light source that extends the luminaire's lifespan. With sustainability at the heart of her practice, Guisset has said that it's not only the materials to be considered, but the design of the object itself must go beyond the trend to stand the test of time. And now, more than 10 years since its introduction at Maison + Objet, the Vertigo Pendant stands as a testament to Petite Friture's values of creativity, boldness and forward-thinking design.

FLOS: A Defining Collaboration

One of the most recognizable icons of the FLOS catalog, the Arco Floor Lamp celebrated its 60th anniversary with a revival of the original design by brothers and brand co-founders Achille and Pier Giacomo Castiglioni. Since 1962, FLOS has been a leader in conceptual Italian lighting, and the Castiglioni brothers made design history time and time again with their experimental and creative alternatives to traditional lighting. Reimagined in this limited-edition form, Arco K's lead-free crystal base is a chic, contemporary revision to a historic piece that has defined modern Italian design for decades.



Spotlight on Patricia Urquiola

A self-proclaimed eclectic, varied and diverse designer, Patricia Urquiola aspires to the highest standard in all her work. While her career path started with a specialization in architecture, it was the early and influential mentorship of FLOS' Achille Castiglioni that encouraged her to set her sights on the even broader world of design. And much like Castiglioni's own practice, Urquiola begins each design with the same question her mentor would ask: How will people and spaces interact with this object?





From comfortable yet technically brilliant furniture to redefining natural light, as she does with Almendra–a sustainable, modular lighting system inspired by colors found in nature and created for FLOS–Urquiola's designs are a seamless reflection of her ambition and visionary expertise.





Omma by Eli Gutiérrez

Designed by Eli Gutiérrez, LZF's Omma takes form as a suspension lamp, table lamp, floor lamp and wall lamp. Composed of a movable wood veneer edged with metal, the design's individual leaves can rotate up to 180 degrees.



Nodes by Kelly Wearstler

Pulling from vintage fashions and the gold-plated architecture of eras past, Kelly Wearstler juxtaposes materials, patterns and colors to create contemporary, risk-tasking interiors that balance spontaneity and sophistication. Valuing texture and materiality, her designs move beyond the realm of simple objects and become a stimulating, sensory experience.

The Nodes collection takes up the charm of Old-Hollywood glamour in the form of pendants, chandeliers, sconces and more. Svelte silhouettes that offer a subtle shine thanks to their bronze finish and warm glow, the Nodes collection instills a quiet drama within interior spaces.





Born in Valencia, Spain, Gutiérrez studied at the Royal College of Art in London before taking her designs to Milan and Paris. Now working out of her own studio somewhere along the road between Valencia and Paris, the designer combines traditional craftsmanship, new technologies and an undeniable love of authentic materials and color in her many collaborations with design brands around the world.



Eny Lee Parker

A spatial, lighting and furniture designer, Eny Lee Parker opened her namesake studio in New York in 2017. An accomplished ceramicist, clay remains Parker's primary medium, and she often begins each new piece by sculpting a miniature version that acts as both model and inspiration as she develops her lighting and furniture designs. Reflecting an appreciation for the slowness of creation and the intentionality of artisan craftsmanship, Parker's organic designs—both in shape and color palette—are sculptural pieces that float seamlessly between minimalism and maximalism while never losing sight of functionality.

With threads of inspiration that arrive while walking the streets of Paris-where she opened her own studio in 2012-or drawing at a café in Prague, Koldova builds on her home country's longstanding history with glassmaking, a material that presents its own unique challenges and surprises, through her singular creations that culminate in vibrant colors, unsuspecting proportions and an elegant, inherent charm.



Lucie Koldova

"I need to know the direction of the piece before I begin. When I know the concept, I keep on sketching and searching for the right idea."

Born in the Czech Republic, Lucie Koldova brings a poetic eye to the world of lighting design. Focusing on glass, wood and metal materials, Koldova combines expert craftsmanship with cutting-edge technologies to create sophisticated and experimental lighting fixtures.

In 2010, Koldova took the helm as Art Director for Czech studio Brokis, where she conceived some of her very first collections while supporting a number of the brand's most commended designs, including the Muffin collection, created with designer Dan Yaffet, and the material-mixing Mona collection.



Mid-Century for the Modern Century

Designed in the 1950s, these pieces are fit for an eco-conscious future.

As brands and makers look toward using more sustainable methods of production, Copenhagen-based Mater is pushing the industry toward a greener designscape by committing itself to a practice of timeless design made from eco-friendly materials and circular production techniques.





Re-envisioning Nanna and Jørgen Ditzel's 1955 Ocean collection, Mater took to the seas. Now crafted from recycled fishnets and hard plastic fished from the ocean, each chair is created from 960 grams (about 2 pounds) of ocean waste while staying true to the original vision.

Another eco-friendly reimagination is Esben Klint and Børge Mogensen's 1950s collection, Conscious, available exclusively at Lumens. Made from FSC-certified wood and Mater Circular Materials, the innovative use of recycled coffee and repurposed plastics come together to recreate this mid-century collection for the modern era.

With a mission to become the world's definitive zero-carbon lighting brand, Tala is invested in fully circular and repairable design in tandem with energy-efficient LED technology that lowers global energy demand. In New York City, Stickbulb designs are created with the fewest number of components possible while using recycled and recyclable materials like reclaimed wood from rooftop water towers and building teardowns. And the award-winning Path chair from Humanscale is changing the face—or rather seat—of workplace comfort as "The World's Most Sustainable and Ergonomically Advanced Task Chair."




